- ☒ The airport land originated as a dairy farm in the early 1920s
- ☐ The airport supports 71,160 jobs for a total payroll of \$2.1 billion per year and \$5.7 billion in economic activity
- ☐ Average airfare in Pittsburgh is 10.3% lower than the national average
- ☐ Air Cargo at the airport supports 587 full-time jobs earning \$21 million annually
- ☐ 18,000 cars per day enter the airport
- ☐ 400,000 taxi trips originate from the airport each year
- ☐ Pittsburgh was the first U.S. airport to offer free wireless internet access
- ☐ Pittsburgh has won 35 national and international awards for AIRMALL service
- ☐ The Calder sculpture in the airside terminal has been loaned to the Piazzo dell Esposizioni in Rome, Italy; the Museo Nacinal Centro de Arte Reina Sofia in Madrid, Spain; and the Guggenheim Museum in Bilbao, Spain
- ☐ The Airport Fire Training Facility trains fire fighters from across the United States and its territories
- ☐ The airport recycles all concrete and asphalt from construction projects
- ☐ The airport performed over 9,000 airfield escorts during the days of the G-20 Summit in 2009
- ☐ The popular T. Rex display from Carnegie Museum of Natural History is listed in MSNBC's Top 10 Diversions for Kids when stuck at an airport
- ☐ The airport accommodates more than eight million travelers and nearly 148,000 aircraft operations annually
- ☐ The airport provides nonstop service to Paris on Delta Air Lines
- ☐ The airport has connections to over 100 cities in Europe and beyond on Air France
- ☐ PIT has been recognized by JD Power and Associates and Conde Nast Traveler's Magazine as among the top airports in recent customer satisfaction surveys
