Andy Colter (1882 to 1957) *** Elizabeth "Lizzie" Heinlein Colter (wife, 1877 to 1963)

As stated above, Andrew died in 1957, while his wife, Elizabeth, passed away on 2 January 1963 in Sewickley Valley Hospital, Sewickely, Allegheny County, of arteriosclerotic heart disease (Document 56). Her daughter, Mary Alice Heinlein, filled out her mother's death record, stating that Elizabeth's father's name was John Herberzeheimer, but she did not remember her maternal grandmother's name. This substantiates your claim that she was taken in by the Heinlein family and not their biological daughter.

Lizzie Colter's obituary in *The Pittsburgh Press* listed her children as Mrs. Margaret Frischmann, Mrs. Mary Alice Heinlein, and Walter J. Colter (Document 57). Elizabeth also had a brother, Michael Heinlein, seven grandchildren, and nine great-grandchildren.

Conclusion

We also began tracing the descendants of Andrew Colter and his wife, Elizabeth Heinlein, who had at least four children: Margaret, Walter J., Eleanor E., and Mary Alice. We know that three of the four survived their mother and that at least two of the girls married, so we can begin looking into their families during a future session.
