UNEXPLAINED BLAST IN MOON TOWNSHIP NEIGHBORHOOD

DRUGS, GUNS FOUND IN HOME NEXT DOOR TO EXPLODED HOUSE

Two men still hospitalized following blast; no confirmation of gas leak as its cause

MOON TWP. — As an Allegheny County fire marshal Sunday started investigating a Moon Township house explosion the previous night and workers began the excavating process, Moon police were confiscating marijuana plants and guns discovered in a neighboring home.

While news reporters, photographers and neighbors watched, police officers laid down a blue tarp in the front yard of 1660 Charlton Heights Road early Sunday afternoon and stacked several armfuls of tall marijuana plants.

Officers then carried out rifles, shotguns, ammunition and items used in marijuana-growing operations, such as fluorescent lights.

Police at the scene said they seized 12 long guns



and a .357-caliber Magnum revolver. The homeowner was identified by police as William Amend, 61, described by residents as "a good boy" always willing to help his neighbors.

Moon police filed charges of possession with intent to deliver a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance and possession of drug para-

phernalia against Amend on Sunday night. He has a preliminary hearing scheduled for Oct. 22, according to online court records.

Amend was not at his home during the seizure, which was based on warrants obtained Sunday by Moon police after the home next door was leveled by an
