Student Will Present Talk on Study Abroad

Her topic will be her experiences during the past summer as a participant in Slippery Rock State College's Cultural Studies Academy in Salzburg, Austria.

The experience of a senior at Plymouth-Whitemarsh Senior High School, in the Colonial School District, during the past summer as a participant in Slippery Rock State College's Cultural Studies Academy will be the topic for a special program on Thursday, October 22.

The student, Lisa Doyle, joined by her parents, will present a talk and show a movie on her unusual summer studies in Austria. The program will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will be presented in the Meeting Room of the William Jeanes Memorial Library, Joshua Road, Lafayette Hill.

According to Edward C. Heinlein, Jr., foreign language teacher at Plymouth-Whitemarsh who has had Lisa as a student in his German classes for the past two years, she spent four weeks living with a family in Salzburg, Austria, and studying German at the University of Salzburg. The travel tour and study were organized and supervised by the Cultural Studies Academy under the direction of Dr. Henry Lenz. The academy provides American students with an opportunity to learn a foreign language, in this instance it was German, by living in Salzburg with an Austrian family who speak very little English and by studying German and other related courses,

taught by Austrian professors, at the university. The program also allows the student to earn high school or college credit for the work.

Not all of Lisa's time was spent in the classroom during her four-week trip.

She spent afternoons visiting the sights, including Schlob Werfen and the Ice Caves, Herrenchiemsee Lake and the Salzkammergut Region. She also spent several of the weekends traveling to such other German-speaking areas as Vienna, the Bavarian Castles of the Mad King of Bavaria and Switzerland.
