Edward J. Heinlein Sr. of 109 Camp Meeting Road, Sewickley, died Thursday, Dec. 9 after a tractor which he was operating overturned in a pond on the Quaker Valley Par Three Golf Course on Camp Meeting Road.

According to Chief Michael Lucas of Leet Township, Mrs. Edward J. Heinlein, Jr., a daughter-in-law of the deceased was passing the scene of the accident in her car when she saw the tractor in the pond.

Heinlein, a contractor, was said to have been removing a tree near the pond before the accident. It is believed the tractor skidded on the pond bank and overturned pinning Heinlein down.

He and his son, Edward, Jr. owned the Par 3 course on property once part of the old Methodist camp meeting ground.
