
## HEINLEIN GENEALOGY

## Johann Michael Heinlein (1832 to 1912)

You provided a document which states that among the Heinleins who left Abtsgreuth in 1883 there was a male named Michael, but no ages are provided in this source. Clearly, this was not Johann Michael born in 1832, since he and at least some of his family arrived in New York City aboard the SS Elbe on 5 June 1889 (Document 5). They had sailed from Bremen, Germany, stopping in Southampton, England, on the way to America. Michael Heinlein, age 48, was a farmer who was traveling to Pennsylvania. Accompanying him were Agnes Heinlein (age 46), and their assumed children: Joh[anne]s (age 25); Elisab[eth] (age 20); and Fried[rich] (age 15).
