

HEINLEIN GENEALOGY

KONRAD HEINLEIN (1863 TO 1942)

I am setting up this session and have discovered a possible problem right away. On Ed's tree, he has the oldest child of Johann Heinlein (1836-1919) as Conrad Heinlein, born 21 May 1862 or 1863 or 1866 in Neustadt an der Aisch; died 1942. When we found this family in German records, we did not identify such a child, and Conrad was born before his presumed parents married in 1865. Also, Johann Heinlein and his wife, Margaretha Wacker, had a child named Johann Conrad born 21 July 1868 in Muenchsteinach, also in Neustadt an der Aisch County.

I found the death record for Konrad Heinlein, who died 20 July 1942 in Robinson, Allegheny Co., PA. That record says he was born 21 May 1863, and was the son of Konrad Heinlein and [Unknown] Ruprecht. So, is Ed's Conrad/Konrad the same as the child born in 1868, despite the different birth dates and parents' names. I'm not at all convinced of that. If the Conrad who immigrated and lived in PA was the son of Johann and an unknown first wife with the maiden named Ruprecht, why did Johann and his second wife then name another child Johann Konrad in 1868? That would be unusual.

So, I'm a bit leery of tracing descendants of Conrad/Konrad Heinlein (1863-1942) if he is not a member of this immediate family, but possibly a cousin.
