Michael John Heinlein was born October 6, 1895 in Coraopolis, PA. His wife, Wilamena Marie Ehle was born in Imperial, Pa., November 24, 1895 to Mr. & Mrs. Charles Ehle. Mike's parents were Mr. & Mrs. Mikel John Heinlein, Sr. They had nine children, five boys and four girls. The boys were Michael, Jr., Carl, Edward, and Richard. The girls were Elsie, Ida, Ann, & Norma. Five of the children are still living.

Minnie Heinlein was 90 on November 24, 1985. Her residence is St. John's Lutheran Home in Mars, PA, where she is still active.

Mike started out as a farmer in Clinton, PA. There he worked with his father until the age of 16. As a boy he learned the baking trade and they bought the Heinlein Bake Shop on the corner of State Avenue and Chestnut St. in Coraopolis. The family moved to Imperial and Mike went back to farming. In 1923 Mike and his brother Harry started Heinlein Brothers Building Co. Together they built over 100 homes in Coraopolis, Neville Island and Sewickley. The partnership dissolved in 1929. Mike then moved to Moon Township on Beaver Grade Road and built the Coraopolis Heights Golf Course, opening in 1930. This was in operation for one year and then sold. Mike bought the McCormick farm which was made into a nine hole golf course, opening June 15, 1932. In 1937 he built nine more holes to complete an 18 hole golf course Bon Air.

In 1954, partially retired, his sons Herb and Harold took over the course. In 1964, he was instrumental with the two boys in opening up the Ponderosa Golf Course.

Mike enjoyed fishing at his camp in Port Severn, Canada, hunting at his camp in Kelly Pines, PA and spending his winters at his Florida home in Hollywood.

Mike died on August 9, 1975.
