I want to know the farms in Moon Township from 1884 till they were sold to John Bell of Carnegie and the Bell Farm in the mid-1920's. I have no interest in the houses of Heinleins in Moon Township or Coraopolis. I want to know the dates of purchase, prices, size of the farms, and the address. I am including below and with an attachment, the information I know of where the farms were and information about Bell Farm. Please add Andy Colter to the list of brothers with farms (Johann Heinlein, father; Konrad, John, Mikel John, and Jim). Is it possible to get copies of the farm research?

1. Bell Farm and Greater Pittsburgh Airport
2. The farms were sold to John A. Bell from Carnegie, PA in the early 1920's, who built a major commercial dairy farm on his 1,900 acres.
3. In 1927, the Bell Farm was sold to Ed Reick, a Pittsburgh Dairy owner and his partner, C. L. Nettrour.
4. On April 20, 1942, the Bell farm was leveled to build an airport.

5. Where were the farms in relationship to the runways and terminal for Greater Pittsburgh Airport, Scally's Golf, or Resurrection Cemetery?
