Bell in the early 1920's. The Deed Adsectum volumes are Grantee (or Buyer) of a property. I searched the index from 1916 until 1919 and there are NO properties transferred from any Heinlein nor Colter in those years. I searched the index from 1920 until 1923, also with no such transfers.
