		<p>c. The Index beginning in 1924 for last name beginning with B for Bell, and given name J for John is missing. I spoke to the employees of the Recorder's office and they have no idea where that index is. It was never returned in the time I spent there.</p> <p>The next index begins in 1932, too late for the search I was performing.</p> <p>I next tried to find transfers from the Heinleins to John A. Bell and found none after 1911 until the 1930's.</p> <p>d. The Deed Direct for sellers last name beginning with H (Heinlein) and given names from K to Z (Konrad, Michael) is also missing, having been moved to the Copy Area and unavailable to me.</p> <p>There are some gaps which I cannot search since the volumes are missing.</p> <p>I located some information which has the possibility of help. On March 13, 1893 Konrad Heinlein and Michael Heinlein purchased 125 acres for \$5,000.00 This was one the 58 Deeds mentioned above. These Deeds are very old with statements like "Beginning with a pin in a locust tree..." and would require checking many of the 58 Deeds to narrow down a more exact location and then find a more accurate location. A large tract of land may be part of the 1900 acres owned by John Bell.</p> <p>In the mid 1920's there were three Deeds transferred by Sheriff's Deeds from Konrad Heinlein. It would require more research to see more information.</p> <p>I next looked for property sold by John A. Bell to E.E. Rieck and C.F. Nettrour. This information is a little confusing. On March 4, 1927 John A. Bell had a Deed recorded giving him ownership of 1101.01 acres of land in Moon Township and Findlay in the form of 10 tracts of various acreage from 10 separate owners, none of whom was a Heinlein nor a Colter.</p>
