Herbert Heinlein, who died in 2006 at the age of 89, stayed involved with the family business through his mid 80s.




One of the happiest moments in the Heinleins' long association with golf was when Matthew Heinlein was married five years ago at the first tee at Ponderosa.

"It can be a tough business at times," Mike Heinlein said. "It's 24/7 from March 1 to maybe the end of November. During that time, it's almost like we have no life.

"But like I said, this is what we do and we hope to be doing it for a long, long time."
